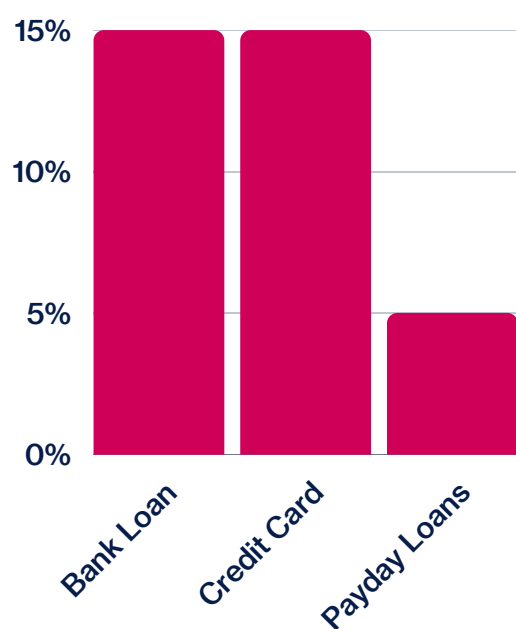

Many students resort to loans and ways of income that can leave them in debt



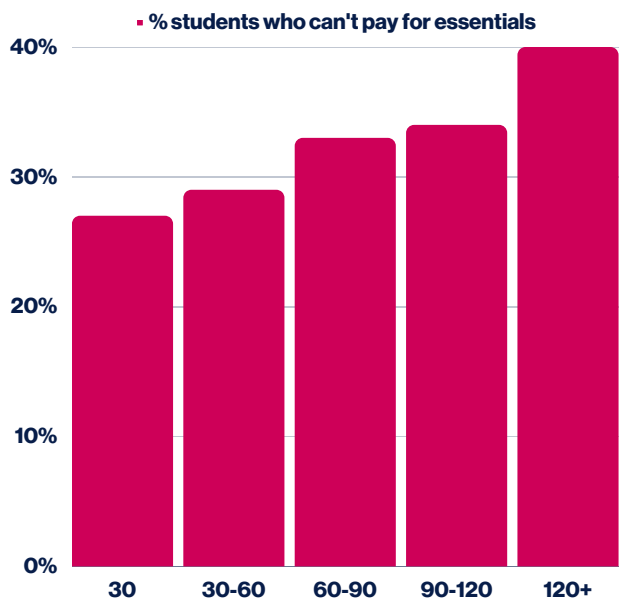

IMPACT OF TRAVELLING

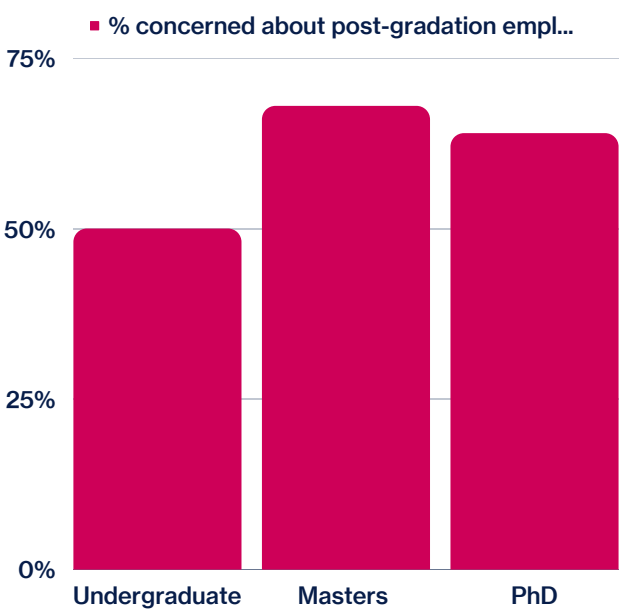
Longer commutes for work and/or study means less expendable income
