### What are the GSU Elections?



Each year the Students' Union picks its political leaders who ELECTIONS make up its four-person Officer Team. 1 President and 3 GSU Officers!

They work **full time** for a year from June until June and either take a year out of their studies, or if elected in their final year, work as recent graduates. Occasionally the current Officers re-run for a second term (two years is the maximum time allowed).

During their time in-post they attend University meetings speaking on behalf of the students and the Union, they run activities, campaigns and they support students who contact them on a day-to-day basis.

GSU is a democratic organisation and thus elections are needed each year to give a mandate to the Union's leaders. This is enshrined in the Education Act 1994

- Nominations Close 28th February 11am
- Candidate Training 28th February 4th March
- Voting Period 7th March 10am 10th March 3pm
- Results 11th March from 5pm Lower Deck and Online
- New Officer Team start at the <u>end of June</u>

- Encourage students to participate in the elections and read manifestos.
- Support any student who is interested in running to be a GSU Officer to contact the Elections Team.

#### A few pointers on rules...

- University staff should be impartial towards candidates and not participate in campaigning.
- Students may approach you asking to do lecture shout outs decide early if you want to offer this to candidates. Candidates must not campaign in lectures/online classes without permission from the Lecturer and must not cause disruption to teaching.
- If you have student status yourself, you can vote so ensure you have a say on who represents you.
- Candidates cannot use union or university channels to campaign if you have student staff with access to social channels or email list, please be aware it is not acceptable for them to use these platforms.
- This job is not considered a placement year, UGIC Students are not eligible, Jan/March starters should contact the elections team to check their eligibility.
