3. To give student feedback you receive to Assembly. 4. To participate in reflective and informed discussion, leading to decision making that will:

i. Improve the University experience ii. Address disadvantages faced by students in the community

iii. Enforce what students expect from their Students' Union and Representation

5. Identifing problems, analysing issues and shaping solutions.

Assembly endeavours to allow all members to participate and be involved in the discussions and decision making.

Safe Space

Assembly follows the Safe Space Policy which respects protected characteristics.

Accessible

Members should not feel isolated or alienated by other assembly members conduct or discussions.

Empowerment

Assembly empowers all voices and values all contributions.

Open-minded

Members are open-minded to the information and views relayed by others.

Balance

Assembly believes a balanced debate with opposing views and opinions helps to make informed decisions.

Approval

is given by a majority vote from registered members

The Chair is here to support you in any way they can by: 1. Supporting you in writing and forming your submission to take to Assembly.


2. Facilitate deliberation, ensuring all members can contribute and participate.
