# 1. Academic Changes

Bio: In our December research, many issues students identified for the SU to work on in the next academic year were academic related. With the importance of representing your academic interests, we wanted to ask you what you thought needed changing in this area.

# 2<sup>nd</sup> VOTED PRIORITY:Personal tutor support


- Support from personal tutors is crucial to students' academic experience





# 3. Opportunities










# 4B. Avery Hill Campus
