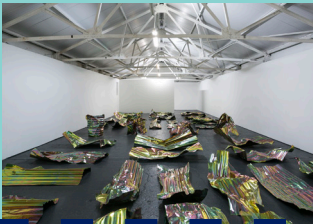

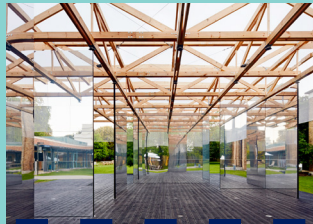

Dulwich Picture Gallery

Dulwich Picture Gallery is the world's first purpose-built public art gallery. It was founded in 1811 when Sir Francis Bourgeois RA bequeathed his collection of old masters "for the inspection of the public". It is now a vibrant cultural hub hosting some of the UK's leading exhibitions.

Horniman Museum & Gardens

The museum has been open since Victorian times, since Frederick John Horniman first opened his house and extraordinary collection of objects to visitors. The gallery holds anthropology and musical instruments, as well as an aquarium, butterfly house and natural history collection.
